Online Credit/Debit Card Payments for Fines

No longer are library users barred from using their accounts online once they have reached the \$5.00 threshold. COMPUTER CLASSES

► Sign Up for a Free Email Account

This is an on-going service provided by the library. We assist people on an as-needed basis, but recommend that you call first to ensure that staff are not hosting another program during your desired time.

► Word Processing (Limit 6)

Wednesday, October 27: 5-6 PM

Participants will create a basic document using Word. This sample document will then be used to practice editing and to try some additional common functions.

▶ Basic Internet Searching (limit 6)

November 9, 11, 16: 5-6 PM

This multi-session class is for adults with little to no experience using the internet. It will be helpful if you have some experience using a mouse. If you feel you need a little practice with this before the first day of class, come in and request a little one-on-one tutoring using some exercises we've devised. There's nothing to it!
